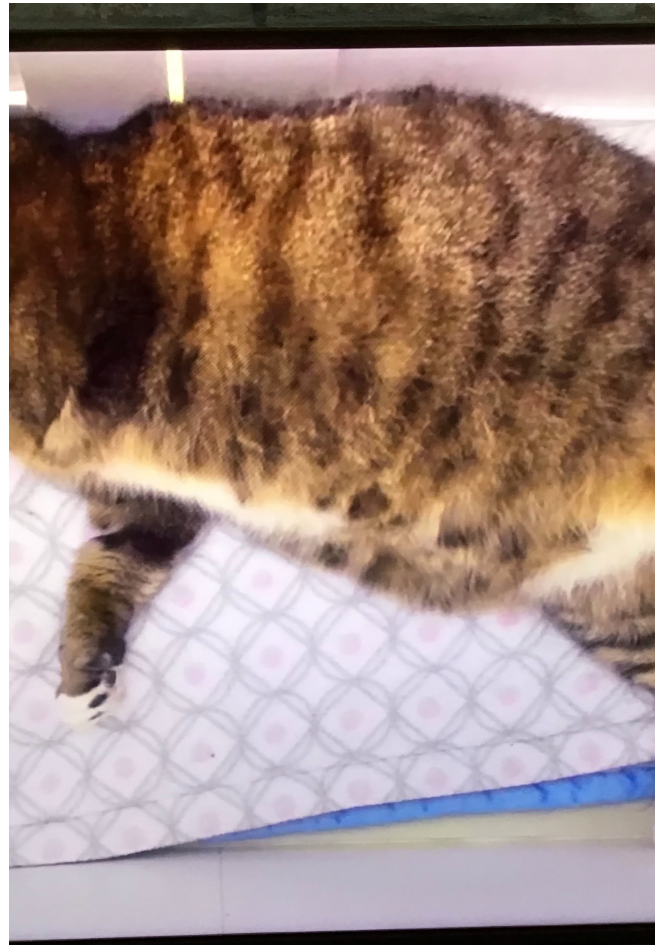


Image above - Harvey, who just wants to sleep, but knows that his camper won't unstick itself.
