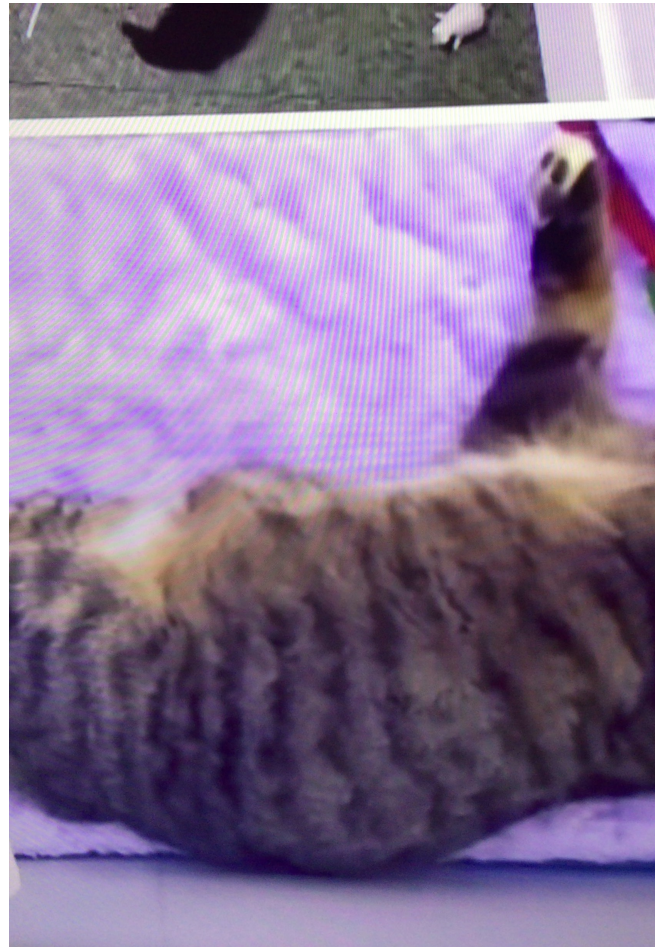


Image above - Harvey, who went to Naya's house to watch Mavis compete but had to pay the extra snack fee that was meant for kittens.
