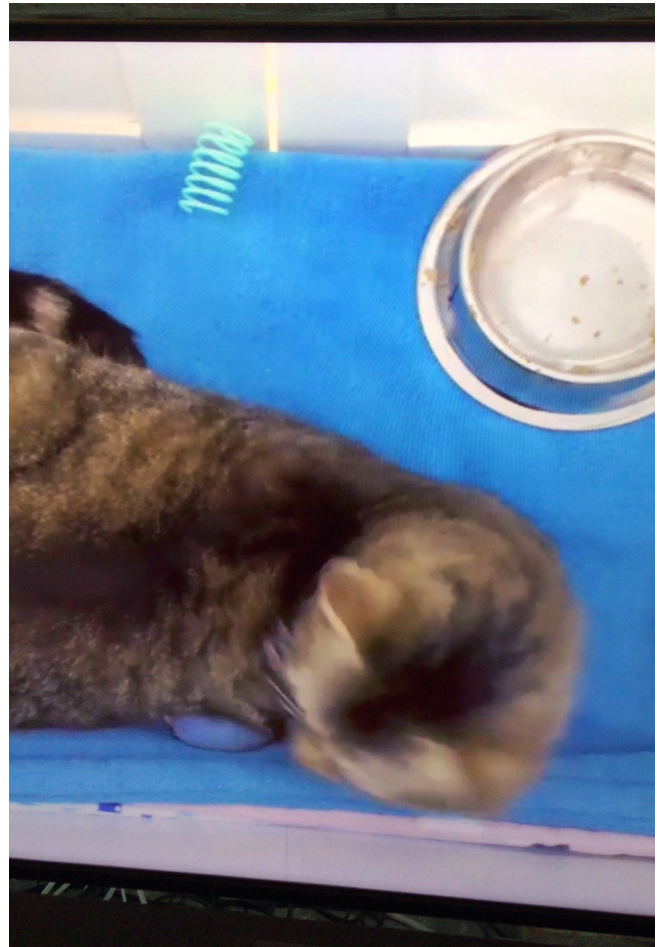


Image above - Harvey, who is watching the juggling competition while drinking a large soda.
