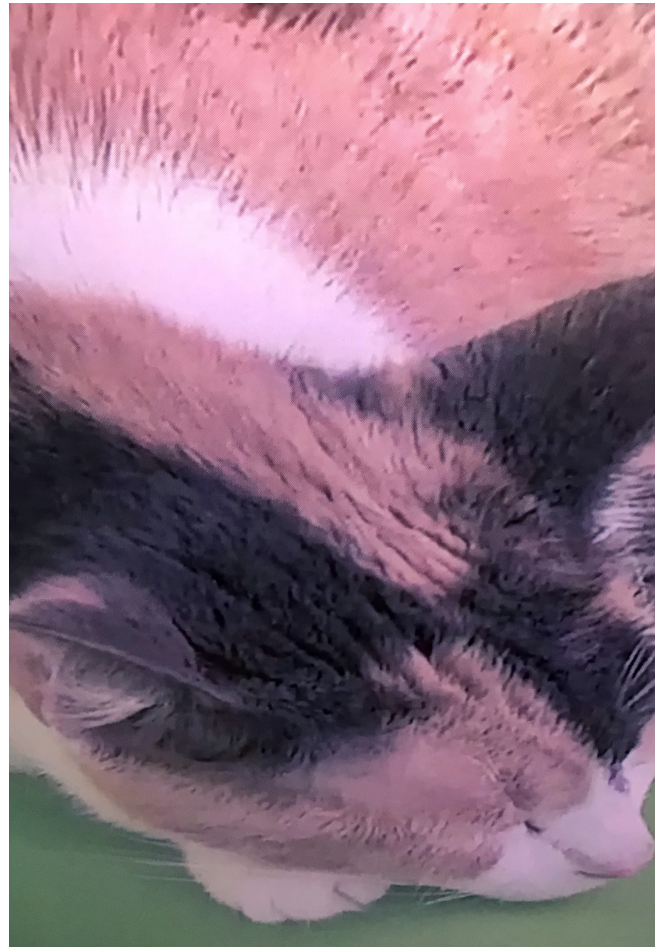


Image above - Juliet, who sledded with Blackpelt and all of her kittens today.
