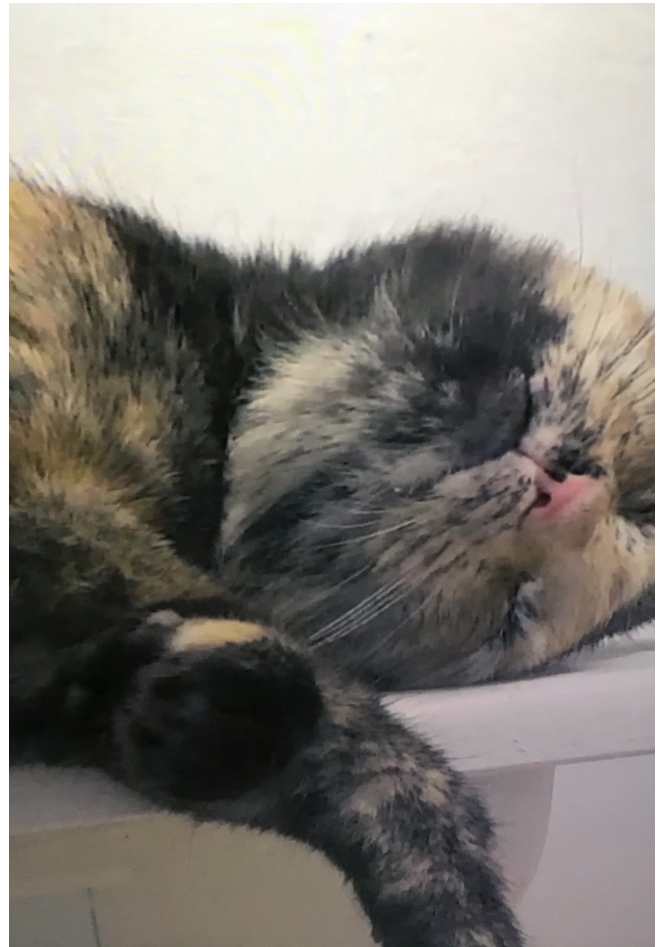


Image above - Judy, who's not going to go back to the town pool until the pee percentage is below one percent.
