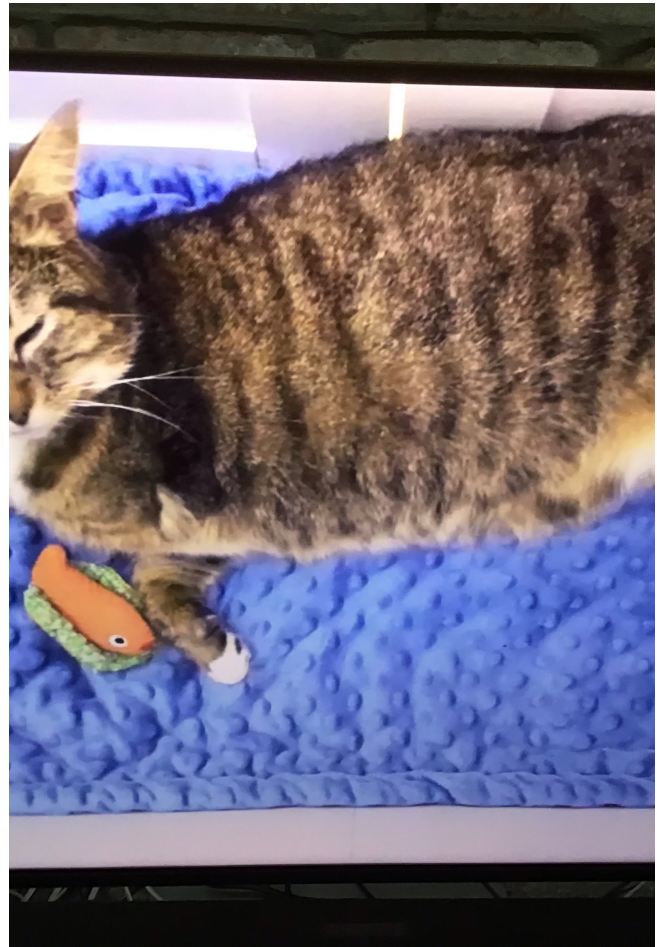


Image above - Harvey, who eats five candy canes a day during the holidays.
