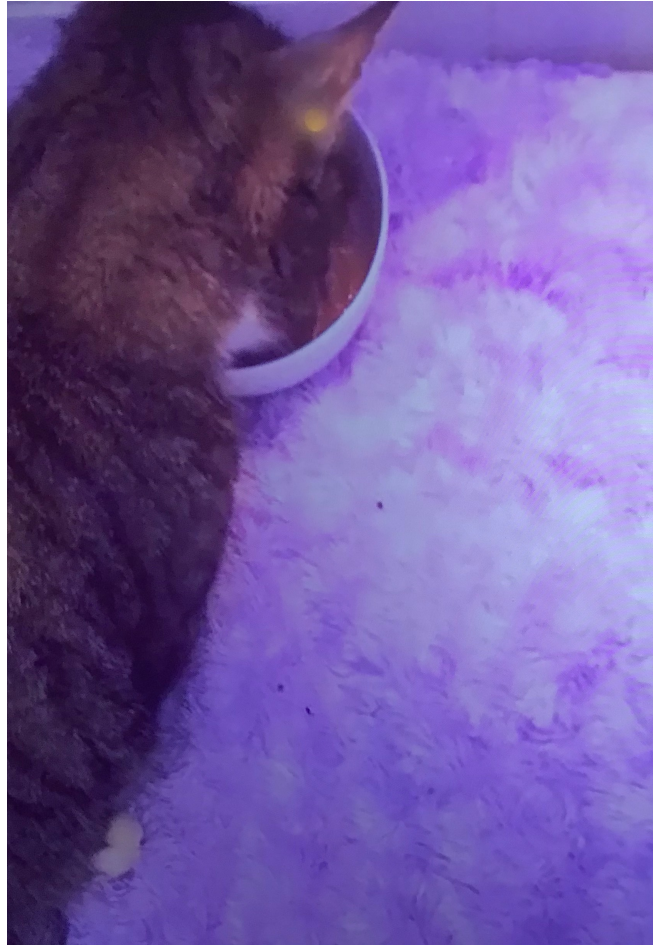


Image above - Harvey, who's happy there isn't a curfew for older cats.
