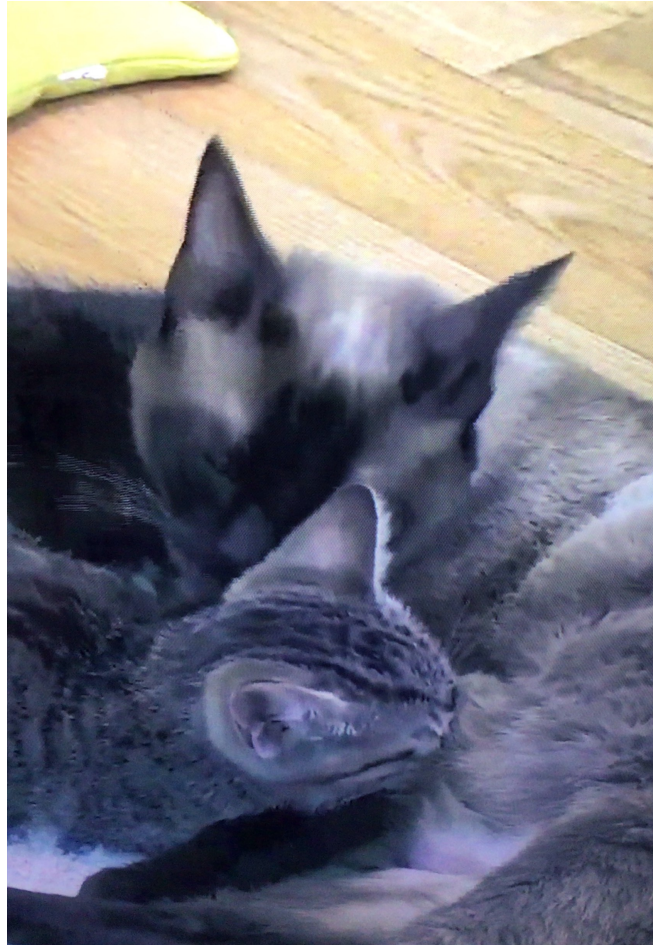


Image above - Lunch, concerned about the drop in business at her luncheon.
